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ABOUT US

Our Mission

Chenla Children's Healthcare's mission is to deliver holistic pediatric care and clinical outreach to surrounding communities in eastern Cambodia provinces **where the needs are greatest**. Working in direct partnership with the Ministry of Health (MoH) of the Royal Government of Cambodia, Chenla provides patient services to children in need, improves the infrastructure and health systems of the provinces, and improves health worker education in the region. We are currently operational in Kratie, Mondulkiri and Stung Treng Provinces and working towards further expansion.

Our Model

Chenla Children's Healthcare is part of a public-private partnership and integrated within the Royal Cambodian Government Referral Hospital system. Utilizing existing government facilities, medication, supplies, and staff, Chenla adds resources to provide international-standard medical care to children suffering from infectious disease, febrile illness, premature birth, and a broad range of pediatric diseases. We follow Cambodia's health equity fund (HEF) system which provides free or discounted healthcare to eligible families. Chenla collects revenue from donors, reimbursement for care provided to Health Equity Fund (Cambodia insurance for the poor) patients, and patient-paid fees. We provide care to a diverse community, including ethnic minorities, migrant workers, undocumented immigrants and many others in this remote region. **No child is ever turned away.**

Since 2016, Chenla Children's Healthcare has proven itself adept at providing life saving pediatric care where the needs are greatest in Cambodia. **Now we aim to scale further.**

Our public-private partnership model is unique in its flexibility, collaboration, and leverage. We are flexible in order to meet the needs of any child who comes to us. We ensure, regardless of cost, that every resource available is provided for each child who arrives severely ill or injured. Collaborating closely with local government and partner organizations amplifies the impact of our efforts, making them much more effective than working alone. This collaborative support serves as our leverage, enabling Chenla to achieve remarkable results for sick and injured children, even in the remotest parts of Cambodia. 2023 YEAR IN REVIEW

In 2023, Chenla provided urgent, life saving care for 23,919 emergency room/outpatients, 4,077 in-patients including 1,142 Pediatric Intensive Care Unit patients, and 1,081 Neonatal Intensive Care Unit patients.

When Secretary of State for the Ministry of Health His Excellency Sann Sab Ey recently visited Kratie Provincial Hospital, he lauded us with praise for the high quality work we are doing and for the advancements the entire hospital has made since Chenla Children's Healthcare was established. The increased revenue to the hospital he noted has catalyzed improvements for the entire hospital, not just pediatric care. But what he said struck him most was seeing the dedicated Chenla staff members Dr. Minea and nurse Puthea rush a new born baby through the heavy rain from the delivery ward to our building. He expressed his strong hope that we would be able to start our new construction soon so that newborns would no longer have to be rushed from one building to another through the outdoors, and he thanked the entire team for their dedication to saving lives.


Continuing Education and Volunteers

Chenla provides a very rich environment for medical education and practical training. We focus on our junior staff, young Cambodian doctors rotating through from other organizations, Cambodian nursing students and ancillary healthcare personnel including housekeepers and security guards in a pediatric hospital setting. We also provide highly selective volunteer opportunities for both international medical experts and some medical students.

In 2024, we were thankful to have academic volunteers from The University of Minnesota Pediatric Intensive Care Unit, East Tennessee State University Pediatrics Department, National University Hospital Singapore and Mercy Medical Center Kansas City. Their highly practical knowledge and engagement in teaching us was greatly appreciated, and we look forward to continued curriculum development together. We welcomed a group of young academic volunteers from Furman University who provided both clever debate and a compassionate spirit that will long live as a part of Chenla.


Four members of our team attended GPP in Singapore and gained greater understanding of similarities and differences between the medical systems in each country. The major takeaway point was that our team members were greatly reassured that even in a high level facility such as National University Hospital Singapore, some parents and families expressed frustration with the system of care. Meanwhile, 22 members of our team attended medical seminars and conferences in Cambodia including the annual Angkor Hospital for Children Pediatrics Symposium.




Annual ICU and NICU Admissions



• The under-5 mortality rate increases with increasing birth order, from 16 deaths per 1,000 live births for first-order births to 34 deaths per 1,000 live births for fourth- to sixth-order births. This relationship is also observed for infant mortality.
